The CCoM held its community outreach Christmas concert on December 17, 2011. The concert attracted a large audience as many CCoM members invited family members, friends and neighbors to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ presented in a very unique way.

Unlike traditional Christmas programs which typically focus on the birth of Jesus, the CCoM concert presented the complete gospel of Jesus Christ....from His miraculous birth, through His glorious resurrection and the blessed hope of His return. Jail Ministry

In addition to Reggie's daily presence, the CCoM has four other ministries at the Manassas Adult Detention Center (ADC):

- Daily - mail delivery (all inmates)
- Weekly - Sunday with inmates in the main building
- Bi weekly – every other Friday with inmates in the Men In New Direction (MIND) Dorm
- Monthly - every first Sunday with inmates in the work release program



Manassas Adult Detention Center

CCoM is one of few local churches that maintains a daily commitment to the men at the ADC. In fact, we have the most frequent presence at this facility to lead Bible study and worship, to offer prayers, or to provide counseling as requested.

During our January visit to the to the work release section of the ADC, one of the correction officers gave a testimony that CCoM reaches more inmates with the gospel of Jesus Christ than any other local church that visits that facility. The officer testified that average attendance size for Bible study at the Work Release section is between 5 to 7 inmates per session; however, CCoM is attracting between 15 to 20 inmates. How right she was! Our January 1, 2012 Bible study attracted a total of 21 inmates....by far the largest attendance we have seen in that part of the jail.

During one of our weekly Sunday visits to Pod B of the ADC, we had a Hindu attend one of our Bible study classes because he “felt drawn into the classroom.” What’s interesting to note is that the lesson for that day was about identifying the true Jesus of Biblical revelation.

Manassas Rehab and Nursing Home

The ladies at CCoM visit the Manassas Rehab and Nursing Home every other month on the third Sunday of the month. We spend about an hour of worship and fellowship with the residents during each visit. We’ll sing songs, read scriptures, pray, and enjoy close fellowship with the women at the rehab and nursing home. They love to see the children so we encourage them to come as well!
